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What is Child Abuse?

Child abuse may include physical, sexual, or emotional abuse; neglect; or exploitation.

At Good Shepherd Primary School we are committed to keeping your child safe by:

- helping every pupil develop strategies to keep themselves safe.
- ensuring that every member of staff is vetted.
- responding appropriately where any concerns are raised about a child.

Teachers and parents have responsibility for the welfare of the children in their care.

It is important that you, as parents, are aware of these arrangements and know to inform the school of any concerns you may have about the safety of any child at Good Shepherd Primary School.

Do not hesitate to contact the school if you have a concern or a complaint. We all have a duty of care to protect children and their welfare must always be our priority.

How can I report alleged abuse of a child?
